Good News!! We are announcing the new Invasive Species Management Initiative (ISMI).

The program formerly known as the Regional Inlet Invasive Plant Program that was administrated by the Adirondack Park Invasive Plant Program/TNC is returning under a new name and leadership. Adirondack Research is launching ISMI through a generous sponsorship and with the help of The Rotary Foundation.

From your perspective, the program will remain mostly unchanged. Services for knotweed and other terrestrial invasive species such as *Phragmites* and wild parsnip will remain free for Adirondack landowners in the program. This is possible through generous donations with the purpose of managing invasive species.
